



**Notice is hereby given that a key decision will be taken by Cabinet at its meeting on 10 December 2018.**

**Vehicle Emissions, Public Health and Air Quality - a strategic approach to parking charges 2**

When a matter is a key decision and has not been advertised 28 days prior to the date that the decision is required to be taken, and it has also not been possible to give five clear days notice, then the decision can still be taken if the provisions of Rule 15 (Special Urgency) of the Access to Information Procedure Rules Part 4B of the Constitution can be applied once agreement has been obtained by Chair of the Overview and Scrutiny Commission, that the decision cannot reasonably be deferred

Councillor Southgate in his capacity as Chair of the Overview and Scrutiny Commission, has approved the use of Section 15 - Special Urgency.

The reason for urgency is in order to enable Cabinet to review the "Vehicle Emissions, Public Health and Air Quality – a Strategic Approach to Parking Charges 2" paper with the "Vehicle Emissions, Public Health and Air Quality – a Strategic Approach to Parking Charges 1" in advance of a final set of proposals being forwarded on to the Sustainable Communities Overview and Scrutiny Panel to consider in January 2019.

Cabinet needs to review the second and final paper in December to enable Sustainable Communities Overview and Scrutiny Panel to see a full set of proposals to comment on, in advance of Officers undertaking essential work on the relevant traffic management orders in the New Year.
