Process under the Injunction. Any number of vehicles.

Police or council become aware of occupation and notify each other

Trespasser advised by council officer or bailiff (employed by the council or the High Court) of presence of injunction and asked to leave ASAP

The Housing Options Manager, the Assistant Direct of Adult Social Care and the Interim Safeguarding & DOLS Team Manager will be notified of the location of the encampment and will be provided with details of the numbers of any adults in the group, and whether the group have made the Property Management and Review Team aware of any wellbeing needs. The Housing Options Manager, the Assistant director of Adult Social Care and the Interim Safeguarding & DOLS Team Manager will strive to evaluate those wellbeing needs within 24 hours Monday to Friday inclusive to confirm if there are any issues that should delay enforcement of the injunction

MASH will be notified of the location and will be provided with details of the number and approximate ages of any children in the group and whether the group have made the Property Management and Review team aware of any wellbeing needs. If children are present among the group MASH will strive to evaluate those wellbeing needs within 24 hours Monday to Friday inclusive to confirm if there are any issues that should delay enforcement of the injunction

Council obtains writ of assistance from the High Court that enables the police to assist the council or its bailiffs should the trespassers not leave promptly or quietly.

NB The council will only need to obtain the writ of assistance once – on the first incursion.

If trespassers do not leave ASAP council assembles resources to enforce possession using the powers of the injunction to seize vehicles in liaison with and supported by the bailiffs in police presence. Once site clear of occupiers the council clear and secure the site
